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Classes

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Parental Responsibilities

The NAPS Family Camp Meeting has been carefully and prayerfully designed with the entire family in mind. There is a special children's program during the advanced classes. All other times, children must be with their parents, who are responsible for their supervision unless otherwise approved by the Administrative Staff.

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Weather and Time Zone

Average temperatures in June vary from a low of 69F to a high of 91F. NAPS - Abundant Life Wellness Institute is in the **Central Time Zone**.

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Pets

Pets are not permitted on campus, with the exception of service animals.

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Housing

Amenities:

- Wellness Center Guest Room Private bathrooms, individual AC/heat, hot/cold filtered water fountain, common living room area, direct outdoor access from room, and 1 room with handicapped-access showers.
- Dorm or Dorm Extension Room with four twin beds (bunks), Two families will share a bathroom between dorm rooms, and individual AC/heat.
- Staff Housing Room A room or bed in the home of one of our Staff. Size varies. Get to know one of the lovely families on campus.

Housing Rules

- 1. Quiet time begins at 10:00pm. Please respect your neighbors by entering the homes, speaking, moving things, walking on the floors, and shutting doors silently after 10:00pm. Guests need undisturbed sleep so please be as quiet as possible after 10:00pm.
- 2. Clean up after yourself in the bathroom and be sure to keep your bedroom tidy.
- Absolutely **no food or eating** in the bedrooms, please. Ants and little critters have a way of finding food anywhere, so it is a MUST to keep food in designated eating areas and put in the garbage bins when finished.

To Bring with You

Bring clothing appropriate for the season (Summer, 69-91°F, warm nights and mornings with a chance of rain): dress in light and comfortable clothing. Include clothing and shoes that can get dirty for hands-on classes. Clothing may be casual, except for on Wednesday night when church attire is encouraged (<u>Ladies</u>, <u>please wear modest dresses or skirts</u>). Be sure to pack a jacket and sneakers.

Additional items you should bring include:

Bible, Flashlight with Batteries, Pen, Small Notebook, Water Bottle, Bed Linen/Sleeping Bag, Toiletries (Soap, Washcloth, Deodorant, Toothbrush, Toothpaste, Towel, Shampoo, Conditioner), Brush, Comb, Bug Spray, Sunscreen, Hair Products, and other regular items and personal necessities.

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To Leave at Home

Because the NAPS Family Camp Meeting is intended to serve as a spiritual retreat with a focus on drawing closer to Christ, please do not bring any reading materials, electronic devices, games, or other items that would be a distraction for you or your children.

Please be aware that cell phone signal and internet coverage is limited.

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Meal Schedule

All meals will be deliciously vegetarian with some vegan options for all participants. Please note that all families will be requested to help keep the campus clean after each meal on a rotating basis.

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Daily Schedule

Each day will begin with a group worship, breakfast, and a morning class that is focused on evangelism. Afternoon classes include hands-on training, such as agricultural classes and even canvassing. Each evening we will have a program that is open to the community, where classes will share what they have learned. Most days will begin at 7:00AM and will finish by 8:45PM.
